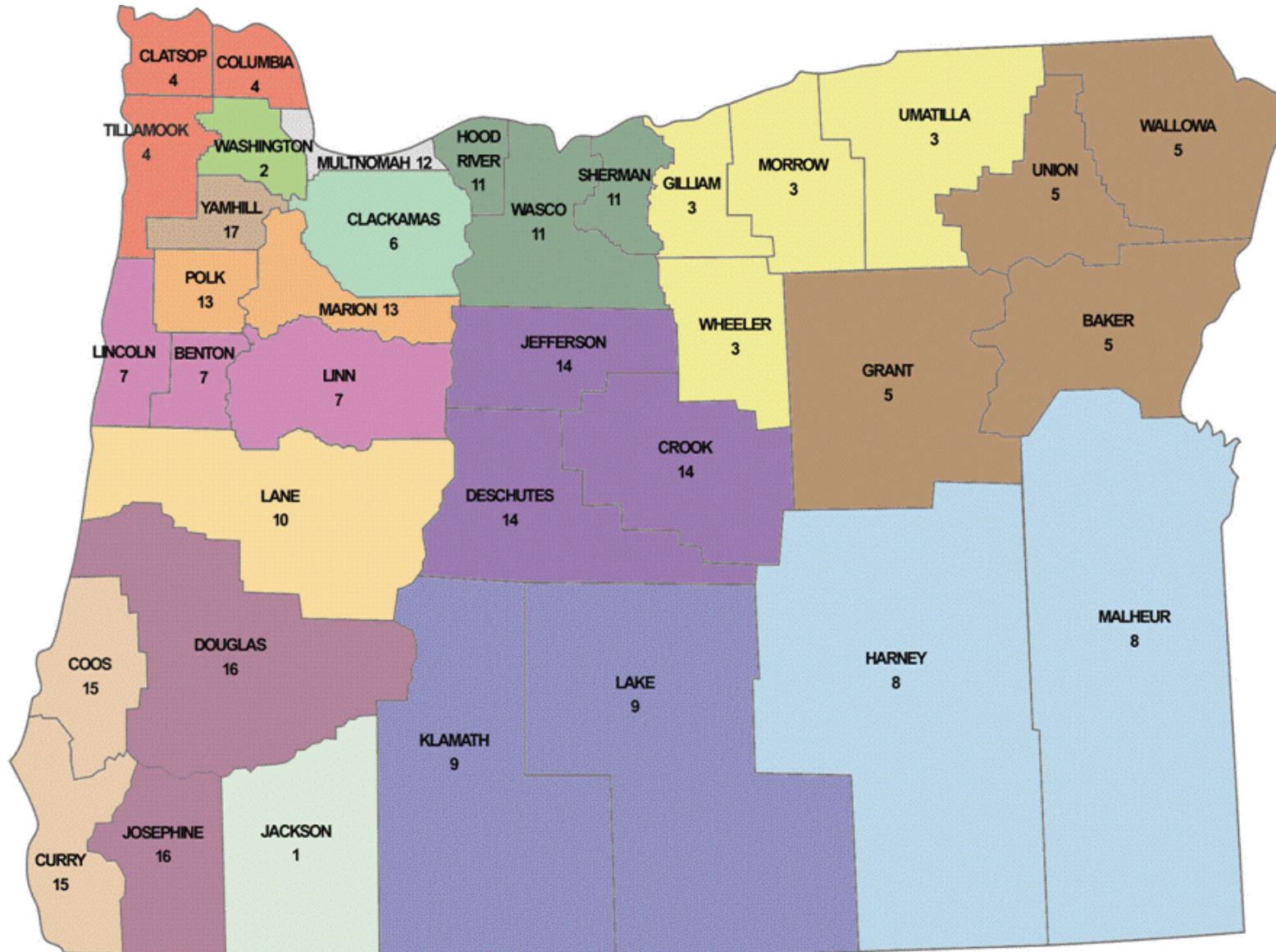

Community Action Agencies, which serve as community-based anti-poverty organizations, have been active in Oregon since the mid-sixties. Some CAAs are private, nonprofit corporations. Others are organized as part of local county government.

Community Action Agencies, provide services that address the full range of family needs—from Head Start and other education and child development programs, to youth and adult employment and training, to services for seniors and the frail elderly. Services are generally coordinated through a case manager or family development specialist. Other CAA programs are designed to strengthen the local economy and develop the community's infrastructure under the guidance of community leaders.

Community Action Agencies are required to have a tripartite board consisting of equal parts of the local private sector, public sector, and low-income community representatives. This structure brings together community leaders from each of these groups to collaborate on developing responses to local needs.

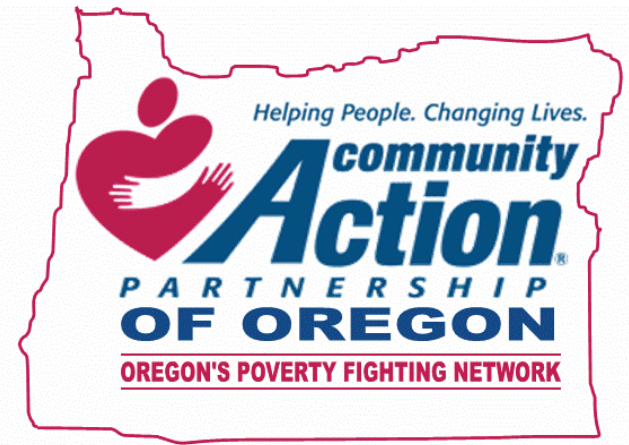
